

The deepest and strongest foundation of adoption is located not in the act of humans adopting humans, but in God adopting humans. And this act is not just part of his ordinary providence in the world; it is at the heart of the gospel. - John Piper

On August 14, 2013 our son, Hudson, was born! Hudson loves birthdays so it is always fun to celebrate him every August. But my wife, Allison, and I were not there at the hospital the day our son was born. We did not know him then. It wasn't until nine months later, on May 29, 2014 that we first met our son. It was a day mixed with emotions. We were excited to meet this little boy who would be joining our family but we were also scared because we didn't know if he would be joining our family for a few weeks, a few months, or forever. Though we were filled with uncertainty and fear, we brought him into our home and loved him as if he were our own flesh and blood. We were able to adopt Hudson in 2015 and we thank the Lord for him every day.

Our story is one of many stories of adoption in our Currey Creek Church community. I am so thankful for a church that supports the foster/adoption community in Boerne and around the world. It was actually a former Currey Creek family's adoption story that encouraged Allison and me to explore foster/adoption for ourselves.

In learning more about fostering and adoption, I grew to realize that adoption is God's idea. Over and over in scripture, Paul talks about how we are adopted into the family of God. As we understand God's plan for adopting us, it helps us to understand the passage in James that says, "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world."

This verse makes much more sense to us after we understand God's purpose and plan in adopting us. We should care for orphans because God cares for us. Plain and simple. The Church is often on the front lines of the pro-life movement, which we should be. But the Church should also be on the front lines of caring for the children in our community and world who are not being cared for. The Church should be the social workers, run the foster agencies, be the foster parents, adopt the millions of children needing homes around the world and the thousands needing homes in our own backyard. We should be the leaders of ALL THINGS ADOPTION! Why? Because we have been adopted by God. We have experienced a loving Abba Father saying "You are no longer an orphan. You are part of my family, a co-heir with my son Jesus."

If you have been praying, thinking, or talking about adoption with others, perhaps God wanted you to read this today. Seek the Lord and may He fill you with all peace, wisdom, and strength.

In the book of Ezra, chapter 3, we read an interesting account of the return of the exiles from the Babylonian captivity. After returning, the people embark on a building campaign to replace the temple that Solomon had dedicated to God. Once the foundation for the new temple was laid there was a mixed response from the people. The younger generation was ecstatic to have a place of their own to worship having been in Babylon most of their lives. The older generation, who had seen the grandeur of Solomon's temple, wept. What a strange building dedication! To have some people weeping while others were shouting praise made for a scene not unlike a football game! You see, some were celebrating the significance of the site while others seemed to be disappointed in the size.

One of the most memorable experiences of touring Jerusalem is a visit to the Western Wall of the Temple mount. It is better known as the Wailing Wall. The wall is made up of 45 stone courses but only 28 of them are visible above ground. The first seven courses seen above ground are from the Herodian period and are part of the original structure as are the 17 courses that are underground. One of those underground stones is nearly 45 feet long and is estimated to weigh 570 tons! It is believed to be one of the heaviest objects ever lifted by manpower. The remaining courses above ground are from two different Muslim periods. The four courses on top of the Herodian period are from the 8th century and the next 17 courses are from the 13-16th century Mamluk period. I believe most of this information is lost on those who have come to pray at the western wall. For, where the stones came from, or who laid them, or matters regarding fit and finish, become immaterial to the significance of the site.

Why all this talk about stones? As we open up the new facility, I want us to learn from each of these two stories. First, the significance of our new building is not found in its size. It is big! I want you to know we made the decision to build it this size based upon future capacity and certainly not to impress. Second, the significance is not found in its fit and finish. As one trained in building and design, I know first-hand that any aesthetic is subjective. The true significance of our new building is in its foundational purpose which is to lay the foundation stone of Jesus Christ in the lives of our children and to build upon the foundation of Christ in the lives of our students and adults. Paul writes,

"According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building upon it. Let each one take care how he builds upon it. For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ." – I Corinthians 3:10-11

I'm excited to have this new building used for its intended purpose and I know you are too! Thanks to all who gave financially to make it happen. Thanks to our staff who have worked extra hours to make it great. Thank you most of all to our Lord Jesus Christ for being our cornerstone.
