

ENGAGE ENRICH

As Christians, we are tasked with being ambassadors of Christ. How do we go about fulfilling this heavenly assignment for the glory of God? How do we grow in our knowledge of and relationship with our loving Savior? How do we walk alongside each other well, to be trained and equipped in God's Word? Two words come to mind as we develop this spiritual muscle: discipleship and mentoring.

About five years ago, as God moved in the hearts and minds of the men and women at Currey Creek, a need for adult discipleship came to the forefront. Through the prayers and discernment of Darla Free and Kelly Hohne, the idea of a mentoring seminar for women's ministry was born. Kelly contacted Shirley Mills, a former Teaching Leader, Area Advisor, and Director of Class Administration for Bible Study Fellowship. Shirley had spent the last 37 years training and equipping and was overjoyed at the opportunity to do so at her home church. "Cultivating Life on Life Relationships" was born and made into a Bible study for the spring of 2015. Throughout that year, God used this study to motivate and challenge a handful of women that Shirley was able to personally mentor and train in homiletics, the art of teaching Scripture.

During the spring of 2016, Suzy Caudill, Ramey Miller, Julie McPhail, Itta McKinney, Kelly Hohne, Julie Harrison, and Angela Brunott worked through the book of Joshua. In the fall of 2016, some of these women were challenged with developing teaching outlines from the information they learned in the spring, and lead two weeks of study during that semester. In 2017 and 2018, discipleship continued with more women attending the discipleship training program, teaching from the books of 1 John, Psalms, Ruth and Colossians.

This past year, we saw our largest attendance in women's Bible study, with teaching from Ashley Langenbahn, Catherine Brock, Nive Burris, Laura Grote, and previous teachers. In April, Currey Creek hosted a workshop on "Women in the Word" where women from all over our community learned the importance of developing their observation, interpretation, and application skills in their personal study of God's Word. Multiplication continues, as God has worked in the hearts of those who have benefited from training. For example, this summer Nive Burris led a study on Psalm 119 in her home, using techniques and skills learned from both training and teaching.

Not only has discipleship training continued over the last couple years in women's ministry, it has also expanded to high school students. In the fall of 2016, Shirley led a study on Romans for about a dozen students, with a few of them attending discipleship training as well. These students are currently in college and are reaping the fruit of learning how to study God's Word deeper.

The fruits of discipleship training have also extended internationally. This past summer, our first translation of the Colossians study was translated to Spanish. Gaby Goodman and Alberto Rodriguez-Baez helped with the translation and speaking portions. This summer, Itta Mckinney and Ashley Langenbahn brought copies to Nicaragua and trained 80 women how to study the Bible. Shirley's future goal is to equip women how to train other women how to teach the Word of God. This fall, we invite you to attend our study on "Steadfast in Christ: A Study of 1 and 2 Thessalonians." Multiplication continues, to God be the glory!

Not long ago we finished up our study of the short book of Jude. Jude writes in verse 20; "But you, beloved, building yourselves up in your most holy faith..." Jude's intention was to challenge the believers to whom he was writing to prepare themselves through discipleship. He had written to inform the group that they had been infiltrated by false teachers. This begs the question; How? How does a church that has been established on the true gospel ever succumb to heresy? The simple answer is a lack discipleship, especially an ignorance of the content of the faith. A great question to ask yourselves is, "To Whom do I trust my spiritual development?" Make no mistake, there are many really great Bible teachers around. Their materials are first rate. Their scholarship, impeccable. I encourage you to learn from them! But over the last several years, the Christian landscape has seen several teachers who have abandoned the faith. Their influence at one time or another touched many in the evangelical world. What have they left in their wake? Doubt, anger, and confusion come to mind. Malachi writes of the responsibility of spiritual leaders in chapter 2 when he says; "For the lips of a priest should guard knowledge, and people should seek instruction from his mouth, for he is the messenger of the Lord of hosts. But you have turned aside from the way. You have caused many to stumble by your instruction." When it comes to building yourselves up in the faith, proper knowledge is critical.

But as we all know, knowledge is merely one component of discipleship. Another component, and a critical one at that, is following Christ. Others can give great instruction. Currey Creek can provide environments that are conducive to spiritual growth both in content and example. But no one can make you grow in your relationship with the Lord. I want to challenge you to commit to spiritual growth and discipleship this fall here at Currey Creek. We provide several avenues for growth that will encourage you and strengthen your faith.
