STUDENT MINISTRY —

I never really had much interest in God as a kid. Everything changed for me when I was 15. I heard the good news for what felt like the first time on a student mission trip, and that was when 2 Corinthians 5:15 came alive for me. I realized that if Christ has really died for me, then I can no longer live for myself, my life now belongs to Christ.

I will never forget how pivotal the next 3 years of my life were. I remember my youth pastor, Wes Jones, pleading with us just to read our Bibles. He told me to start in Romans (not the best advice). I was confused at times, but I'll never forget the early mornings spent before school reading and journaling what I was learning about God from the book of Romans. I remember adults serving in the church, men like Jim Booth and Robert LoBasso who had full time jobs but showed up every week to teach us how to study the Bible and live as disciples of Jesus. I remember meaningful conversations in the church parking lot that I am sure they have long forgotten. I remember being in Jim's home and seeing the way he loved his family. I'm not sure those men will ever realize how great an impact they had on me. By God's power the speaker on that mission trip convinced me that I needed to repent of my sin and live for Christ, but it was the ordinary men in my home church who showed me what it meant to live as a disciple.

I cannot tell you how much of a joy it is for me to now be serving in student ministry at Currey Creek. I truly feel I have the best job in the world. Seeing God move in the lives of our students has blessed me in ways I can't describe. 3 John 1:4 says, "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth." There is a real sense in which I feel this way toward our students. I'm proud of them. I love them. Nothing brings me more joy than seeing them grow in Christ.

Our goal is to raise up students who love the Lord and love others, know and abide in God's Word, take their faith home with them, develop Christian community, serve the church, serve the community and share Christ with others.

What I have personally witnessed during my twenty years in Boerne is a generation return to church after a period of avoiding church. They had been active in youth ministry, gone on mission trips, and even served in various ministries. Why then were they absent from church for a period? The painful (and partial) answer is their parents. I certainly don't mean these students had no personal responsibility for their neglect of the bride of Christ. But when parents don't live out their faith at home, when church is sporadic and optional, what type of example are they receiving? Dad and Mom, your actions speak louder than your words and louder than our Student Ministry most of the time. Dad and Mom, be authentic and faithful in your own spiritual walk. Encourage your students to build on what is eternal!

Student ministries used to be characterized by a competition with the entertainment world. Bigger was always better, weekly events needed to be louder and greater than the one before. The idea was to get in bigger bands, brighter lights and large crowds. Often the experience was nothing more than an emotional and spiritual rollercoaster for the students. I'm so grateful for our student pastors Logan, Cole and Kristene! They do a great job of bringing an authenticity to our student ministry. Our student ministry emphasizes a deeper walk with Christ, unity, friendships, and fellowship. Students are affirmed, supported and encouraged to develop deep relationships with other Christian students at a time and place in their life where peer approval is paramount. During the middle school and high school years, a growing relationship with Jesus Christ will propel them to a deeper discipleship through their college years, marriage, and even into parenthood. I'm grateful that our student pastors encourage our students to spend time with God the Father, to read his Word, and to listen to his voice.

It is so easy for our students to feel isolated from the rest of the church. Would you do me a favor? Take the time to encourage our Student Ministers! Interact with our Students! Introduce yourself and tell them how glad you are to see them. They are the next generation of Christian leaders both in the church and in the world!
