A few years ago, Darla and I were visiting Scotland as part of a sabbatical leave provided by Currey Creek. We had just left Castle Sterling and were traveling north to Inverness because we had heard it was a beautiful city (which it is!). We decided to travel down Loch Ness on our way to visit the Isle of Skye. While en route, we came upon Castle Urguhart, a National Historic site, and decided to make an impromptu visit. Inside the castle I read the fascinating story about a priest named Columba who had made a visit to a man named Bridei, who was King of the Picts. Columba was an Irish priest who had left his home in North Ireland and established an abbey on the Isle of Iona that served as a launching point for the evangelization of the Scots, who were at the time very pagan. In or around 580 A.D. Columba left Iona traveling across the Isle of Mull and was making his way up Loch Ness to visit Bridei at Inverness. While en route, he was asked to visit an elderly Pictish nobleman named Emchath who lived near or on the site of where Castle Urguhart sits. Columba shared the gospel while there and ended up baptizing Emchath and his entire family. Columba continued his journey evangelizing as he went and is credited with bringing the gospel to the Scots. If you were to visit the tiny island of lona today, you would find buried in a small abbey 40 Scottish kings, a testimony to the impact of Columba and the gospel.

I'm quite sure that Columba did not understand the influence and impact that he would have upon the history of Scotland. The Irish priest was simply being obedient to what he believed the Lord was calling him to do. In similar fashion, we too need to be faithful to the Lord's call on our life. In Matthew 28, Jesus commissions his disciples to go and make other disciples. Some disciples are called to leave their land and go to another country and share the gospel of Jesus Christ. Most are simply called to be faithful where God has them, sharing the gospel as they go about their daily lives. Many here in Boerne need to hear the gospel of Jesus Christ and become Jesus' disciples. To aid in that endeavor Currey Creek has intentionally started a third service in order to make room for those who already are Jesus's disciples and particularly for those who have yet to become his disciple. We have much work to do if we are going to reach Boerne with the gospel of Jesus Christ. The good news is that God has made a way to reconcile sinful man to himself through the person and work of Jesus.

First, I want to thank you for catching the vision of creating space through a third service at Currey Creek. Second, I want to challenge you to invest in someone who needs to hear the gospel or find a church home, and then invite them to Currey Creek. If we will begin to see Boerne and become burdened for souls as Columba saw Scotland and was burdened for their souls, I believe God will give us a harvest in our community and souls for his glory.
