AN INTERVIEW WITH THE TEAM

When did the idea to create a record emerge?

Isac: When all of this started it was not with the intent to make a record. It started with us feeling the call to song write for our local church. It was and is a daunting task. A few years ago Ben and I attended a worship leader conference put on by Passion City Church. While there we sat in on a songwriting breakout session that changed everything for us. The speaker said, "if you treat songwriting like a hobby it will be a hobby." Ben and I looked at each other and were immediately convicted, we both knew we were being lazy with our sonawriting. From there we would meet once a week to labor over songs, tearing them apart and putting them back together. Before we knew it we had over 12 song ideas that had potential. It was at that point when we began creating a cohesive work of 6 songs, the Exalt record. With the prayer and oversight of the pastors and elders the record came to be. We are really proud of it and our prayer is that it ministers to our local church family.

How long have you all been writing and working on it?

Chase: We've been writing these songs for the past several years. In more recent years, as we all have grown in our faith and with our church family, we've come together to revise and retune these pieces with the church in mind, and they have certainly transformed to the songs that they are today.

Who all has had a part?

Ben: Isac, Chase, Derian, and I all collaborated together on the lyrics and music of Exalt. Our producer Michael Guillot recorded and mixed the record in 2 different studios. Joe Causey of Voyager Mastering completed the final masters of each song.

What is your creative process like? Ben: We like to work on individual song ideas separately, then come together for writing sessions where we refine the lyrics and subject of the song. After that, we'll write some instrument parts and play through them together on stage, it helps us to hear where the song might go. Once we're happy with the whole idea we'll record a rough mix on stage to have if the song eventually goes to the studio.

How do you all go about writing music and lyrics? Does one come before the other?

Chase: Generally the lyrics come before the music, but not always. Sometimes we would come together with a chord sequence or a melody that's sweet to sing to that may inspire us to write a refrain along with it. Or sometimes we'll even turn a song completely upside down and take a risk, which is what Ben did with the drums to Warrior when originally it was much slower. So the business and driving rhythm of the drum and bass seemed to compliment underneath the slow and steady melody of the song. But the lyrics take priority and the music we craft around it simply helps enhance and embellish the theme of that particular worship song.

What was the recording process like?

Isac: Honestly, the recording process was tough. It was so much fun but at the same time so taxing. We rented out a studio in the Southside of San Antonio owned by our previous worship pastor, Jake Kreifels, and had 5 days to record 5 songs. That is a hard task, usually it takes three days to record a single song. Our producer, Michael Guillot, who we flew down from Nashville is the guy who made the record come to life. He brought out the best in us while also being constructively critical. We definitely felt the pressure in the studio to play everything perfectly! Michael is special. He graduated from Champion High school in 2014 and played on the Upstream worship team as well as the

adults teams. At the time he was a fun young kid who was an aspiring Worship Leader. He went on to ACU where he was a big part of The Well (a church we support) and began his journey as a producer. Long story short, there we were in the studio taking orders from a kid who I taught how to wrap a guitar cable. I was filled with joy and proud the whole time. This kid was now a married and an established man who helped make our vision come to life.

What is your heart behind the Exalt record?

Isac: It has always been our motive to write songs that can be sung by our church family. Our hope is that these songs encourage and lift up the body as they are listened to or sung corporately. In an age where there is so much worship material available, we were not trying to reinvent the wheel. We simply wanted to write Biblical worship songs for the church.

What do you wish to communicate most?

Derian: I would like for the goodness, sovereignty and perfect love of God to be communicated through the songs. My hope is that these songs can help people enter into authentic worship wherever they are.

Anything else you would like to share?

Isac: For us ministry will always be first. When we set out to song write we wanted to do it with excellence but not at the expense of our ministries. So, we have no timeline to release another record or even if one will be recorded. That is not the point. We will continue to song write and present the songs to the church during corporate worship and if the pastors and elders believe that we should record another project then we will definitely do it. It is all in the Lord's hands and we trust our pastors and elders. We are grateful for the opportunity to be able to present this record to you.
