the STORY How did we get here?



First Baptist Church

In 2000, Bubba Stahl led First Baptist Church of Boerne to multiply the congregation when it reached approximately 1,000 people on a Sunday morning. That vision was brought to fruition as John Free was brought in to plant a new church in the growing area. John arrived at FBC in August of 2000 and worked with Bubba to put together a core team. Momentum grew quickly, and it was decided that Currey Creek Church would launch sooner rather than later.



Currey Creek Church

On January 21, 2001 Currey Creek began with a core group of people in the cafetorium of Boerne Middle School South. The first 10 years of Currey Creek was hard plowing, but the evidence of God's faithfulness was throughout as people came to know the Lord. In 2012, the church began to grow. As the church grew, Pastor John's heart continued to be fueled by preaching of the Word and looking to multiply churches as had happened with Currey Creek Church.



Bridge Fellowship

In March of 2018 during a staff meeting, John Free put a date down as a goal for Currey Creek's first local church plant. In that moment, Jared Patrick's heart jumped, and he knew that God might be calling him to lead this effort. Through prayer and seeking confirmation with the pastoral staff, elders of Currey Creek, trusted friends, and his wife, Jared felt confident that God was moving him in that direction. Over the next year of prayer and research, the vision for The Bridge Fellowship was born.



Future Churches

The sacrificial giving of both First Baptist Church and Currey Creek Church is represented by the saying, "Churches who believe the gospel, plant churches." With this end in mind, The Bridge Fellowship will have in its very DNA, a church planting mindset. As we raise up leaders, it will be our objective to send out and multiply for the sake of the gospel.


Why are we staying here?

Boerne and surrounding areas have been growing in population dramatically over the last five years. In a recent school board study commissioned by BISD, the results indicated that BISD is on pace to have more than six hundred annual new home starts for the fourth straight year. The district alone has more than 9,800 planned future lots and the school system can expect an increase of approximately 2,400 new students in the next five years. Kendall county is the seventh fastest growing county in the United States and third fastest growing in Texas. There has been a 37% population growth since 2010. Simply put, this is overwhelming growth with even more overwhelming gospel potential. God is bringing people from all over the state, country, and world to the Texas Hill Country, and we want to reach them with the gospel.

Lifeway research finds that new church plants are made up of 42% of people on average who would never set foot in an existing church. This means that a community that is growing desperately needs new churches to start so that many could be reached. It is our desire that new families in our area would be reached through a new church community and that more churches would be planted as the population continues to grow.




APPLY

BELIEFS & DOCTRINE

The Bible

We believe the Bible to be the inspired, the only infallible, authoritative Word of God.

The Trinity

We believe that there is one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Jesus

We believe in the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, in His miracles, in His vicarious and atoning death through His shed blood, in His bodily resurrection, in His ascension to the right hand of the Father, and in His personal return in power and glory.

Salvation

We believe that for the salvation of lost and sinful people, regeneration by the Holy Spirit is absolutely essential.

Holy Spirit

We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit by whose indwelling the Christian is enabled to live a godly life.

Resurrection

We believe in the resurrection of both the saved and the lost; they that are saved unto the resurrection of life and they that are lost unto the resurrection of damnation.

Unity

We believe in the spiritual unity of believers in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone)

We reaffirm the inerrant Scripture to be the sole source of written divine revelation, which alone can bind the conscience. The Bible alone teaches all that is necessary for our salvation from sin and is the standard by which all Christian behavior must be measured.

Solus Christus (Christ Alone)

We reaffirm that our salvation is accomplished by the mediatorial work of the historical Christ alone. His sinless life and substitutionary atonement alone are sufficient for our justification and reconciliation to the Father.

Sola Gratia (Grace Alone)

We reaffirm that in salvation we are rescued from God's wrath by his grace alone. It is the supernatural work of the Holy Spirit that brings us to Christ by releasing us from our bondage to sin and raising us from spiritual death to spiritual life.

Sola Fide (Faith Alone)

We reaffirm that justification is by grace alone through faith alone because of Christ alone. In justification Christ's righteousness is imputed to us as the only possible satisfaction of God's perfect justice.

Soli Deo Gloria (God's Glory Alone)

We reaffirm that because salvation is of God and has been accomplished by God, it is for God's glory and that we must glorify him always. We must live our entire lives before the face of God, under the authority of God and for his glory alone.
